

Charles Manson

Manson is best known for his involvement with seven gruesome murders in Los Angeles during the free love summer of 1969. Among the victims was film actress Sharon Tate, the pregnant wife of Hollywood director Roman Polanski.

In a sensational trial, Manson was found guilty of conspiracy to commit murder and sentenced to death. The sentence was later reduced to a life. Manson's hippie lifestyle and access to Hollywood's elite elevated him to celebrity status. Manson is still relevant in America. The prosecutor reports that Manson receives more mail than any prisoner in U. S. History and that he has attracted a new generation of young followers.

Boys Town

Boys Town is an internationally praised organization headquartered in Omaha, Nebraska. It is dedicated to helping disadvantaged children and struggling families.

Father Edward Flanagan, a young Irish priest, established his home for boys in 1917, accepting boys of all races and religions. From humble beginnings, the Boys Town organization has grown to touch lives in many countries.

Boys Town became legendary with the 1938 film "Boys Town," a biographical drama based on Father Flanagan's work. The movie was nominated for four Oscars and won two, including Best Actor for Spencer Tracy's portrayal of Father Flanagan.

Flanagan is officially being considered for sainthood in the Roman Catholic Church.
